instated 1927 by the Duke of Mouchy, first president of the French Golf Union

To be played at **Golf de Fontainebleau**
Friday April 12th and Saturday 13th (Coupe Patrick Frayssineau)
and Sunday April 14th (Coupe Mouchy)

Grand Prix Elite Messieurs, WAGR : C category (in 2018), National French ranking : 0 category

Coupe Patrick Frayssineau, qualifying event for Coupe Mouchy

- Open to all male amateur players members of the French Golf Union or of any foreign official Golf Union, with a maximum handicap of 4,4
- Stroke Play, gross, 18 holes on Friday April 12th , 18 holes on Saturday April 13th
- No play off for 1st place, in the event of a tie for 1st place, the winner will be the player with the lowest score on the 2nd day, ties being classified by score on the second day,
- 39 best (+ tie) will qualify for Coupe Mouchy

Coupe Mouchy

- Open to the 39 (+tie) lowest scores of Coupe Patrick Frayssineau
- Stroke Play, gross, 36 holes on Sunday April 14th
- Result on the total of the 72 holes.
- If necessary, to determine the winner, a sudden death play-off will be played immediately after the end of the regular event on Sunday April 14th on holes n° 1, 18, 10 and 9. In the event that such a play off cannot be organized, or finished, tied scores will be classified on the best last round, then the last 9 holes, the last 6 and last 3 and, and if equality subsists, by hole from the last.

Rules and regulations (supplemented if necessary by the general regulations of French national amateur events)

- All rounds played from back tees
- Total number of players for Coupe Patrick Frayssineau is 132 including :
 - 106 players selected firstly by taking into account the ranking of the top 2500 players at WAGR, then by the order of the French national amateur ranking, then by handicap (with a limit of 4,4 for this last criterion), all this being at the closing date of candidacy
 - 8 wild cards chosen by Fontainebleau GC
 - 5 wild cards chosen by the Technical Direction of the French Golf Union
 - 13 slots reserved for "licences Or under 16" who do not enter the field via their ranking in WAGR or the French national amateur ranking or their handicap. Those slots will be allocated using the same criteria as the official list of the 106, except for the handicap which could be superior to 4,4.
- French candidates should have paid the "federal play dues", and be up to date in the payment they owe for various French Grand Prix.
- The competition is totally "no smoking".

- A medical certificate of ability to play golf in competition must be provided by all candidates, whether affiliated or not to the French Golf Union, at the time of inscription.

Players should observe the attire regulation effective at Fontainebleau Golf Club (no jeans, no jogging or leggings, tailored only shorts, no tee shirt and no non collar shirts. Soft spikes only shoes. And no mobile phone in the club house or on the course).

Registrations to be received before March 29th 2019 at noon (any player forfeiting after closing of registration will remain redeemable of his engagement fee)

Registration to be sent (together with engagement fee) to “Golf de Fontainebleau, route d’Orleans, 77300 Fontainebleau”, or through our website www.golfdefontainebleau.org (before March 29th 2019 noon).

Draw :

- Departures will be from holes number 1 and 10
- First round’s departure will be decided by the event’s committee
- Second round’s departure will be in the reverse order of the first round, and from a different hole than on the first day
- Round three and four departures will be in the reverse order of the result of Coupe Patrick Frayssineau, and from a different hole in the morning and the afternoon.

Prize giving

Prizes will be awarded on Sunday April 14th 2019, immediately after the end of the last round by Jean- Paul Panié, captain of Fontainebleau GC, to the 3 best scores of Coupe Mouchy as well as the 2 best scores of Coupe Patrick Frayssineau. This will be followed by cocktail and drinks.
